CLEANUP KIT

- Soap
- Toothbrush
- Toothpaste
- Washcloth
- Towel
- Comb (or baseball hat works well)
- MEDICATIONS - To be administered by parent

REQUIRED GEAR

- Sunglasses
- Water Bottle
- Sun Protection
- Chap-stick
- Flashlight
- Gallon bottled water per person)

NO POCKET KNIVES ALLOWED (below the rank of Webelo)!

OPTIONAL

- Watch
- Binoculars
- Camera
- Notebook, Pen/Pencil
- Baseball, Soccer ball, Frisbee, etc.
- Books, Comics, cards, Simple Games
- Fishing Gear (pole, tackle)

NO GAME BOYS, IPODS OR OTHER ELECTRONICS!

SLEEPING GEAR

THERE ARE BUNK BED COTS WITH PADS (BIGGER THAN BATTLESHIP COVE). THERE IS A WOOD STOVE IF NEEDED.

- Pillow
- Sleeping bag or sheets with heavy blanket

Things To Bring On The Campout

EVERYONE WILL BE REQUIRED TO CHANGE OUT OF THEIR DAY CLOTHES INTO DRY CLOTHES BEFORE BED - TO HELP KEEP FROM GETTING COLD!

CLOTHING

- Extra Socks
- Extra Undershirt
- Extra Underpants
- Long Pajamas or sweats (no light pajamas)
- Long underwear tops*
- Long underwear bottoms*
- Long-Sleeved shirt*
- Long pants*
- Sweater*
- Hiking boots or sturdy shoes (no Sneakers)
- Extra shoes/sneakers
- Insulated parka or coat with hood
- Warm Hat*
- Mittens or Gloves*
- Rain gear

ITEMS WITH AN ASTERICK (*) SHOULD BE WOOL OR SYNTHETIC FABRIC.

It is still cold at night and it could rain. ***BRING EXTRA CLOTHS!*** The cars are not far from the cabin and can easily be use to hold extra dry clothes that you will be glad you have. **ALSO** we are on the water front of the lake. Young boys + lake = wet clothes and shoes.

COTTON: *NOT RECOMMENDED!* Once wet, cotton absorbs moisture and will not keep you warm. **IT IS DANGEROUS WHEN CONDITIONS TURN CHILLY, RAINY OR SNOWY.**

WOOL: Wool can keep you warm even when damp. If wool feels scratchy against your skin, wear long underwear or a T-shirt beneath it.

SYNTHETIC: Polypropylene, polar fleece and other synthetics can insulate you whether it is wet or dry. Look for these in long underwear, sweater, vests, parkas, mittens and hats.
