Report of the Trustees of the Free Public Library.

To the Citizens of the Town of Berlin:

The Committee desires to call your attention to the great increase in circulation the past year. 838 more books were loaned this year than last. This bespeaks the growing popularity of the library. It also indicates increasing inadequacy of the present quarters both to accommodate patrons and to shelve books properly. Even now there is not sufficient shelf-room for the nearly 1200 volumes, and with next year's additions the cases will be running over with good reading.

Every public library is to a certain extent an educational influence. This extent is determined by the character of its books, its reference department and its availability to those who would be students. It has been the aim of your committee to render the public library of Berlin such a force in the community, in addition to satisfying the wants of general readers. But under present financial conditions and crowded quarters little can be done either in the reference department or towards making the library more available to the public.

In order to fulfil the best ends of the library's existence your committee would respectfully call your attention to the need of better quarters, for increased facilities, both for books and readers.

We publish in this report a list of new books added during the year, together with a few added last year but not on the catalogue. Cut these lists out and place with your catalogue.

REPORT OF TRUSTEES OF THE PUBLIC LIBRARY.

To the citizens of Berlin:

The past year has been a fortunate one for the library. The Berlin Unitarian Sunday-school gave 48 of their older, more suitable-for-adults books to the public library in September and Miss E. P. Sohier of the State Library Commission, in October gave 50 volumes.

The additions by gift and purchase have taxed to the uttermost, the present accommodations in the selectmen's room. A happy solution of the problem of suitable quarters would be the suggestion of the school committee, that one room in their proposed new school building be for the use of the library.

To give the largest usefulness possible, the library hours have been changed to Wednesday and Saturday afternoons, 3 to 4 o'clock; Saturday evenings 7 to 8; and Grange evenings (2nd and 4th Wednesdays) 7 to 8.

A successful experiment has been tried in a branch for South Berlin. Through the kindness of Mr. Walter, residents of that district have access to a few books at his store, every Thursday afternoon from 2 to 4 o'clock. About 50 volumes are kept in this branch and changed frequently. It has been much patronized. The North, East and West districts are better accommodated than formerly by the scholars who come to the Center and for whose especial benefit the Wednesday nour was established.

These changes will procure for the library \$100 worth of books from the State Commission in conformity with a law passed in 1900.

The Berlin Public Library has been the recipient of several splendid gifts of books during the year. As promised last year the State Library Commission gave half of the \$100 worth granted by law and will probably give the other half this year. Miss E. P. Sohier has recently presented 35 books and from the Northboro Free Library we have received a donation of 78 of their duplicates, a gratefully acknowledged neighborly act.

By using all the available space in the Selectmen's room we have been enabled to provide shelf room for the present. The crying need is for larger and better quarters.

The South Berlin branch library has proved succesful, nearly 200 books having passed through that branch in the year.
