MARCH RECIPE, 2013 Steak Sandwich Recipe

• Prep/Total Time: 20 min.

Yield: 5 Servings

INGREDIENTS

- 1 medium onion, thinly sliced
- 1 medium green pepper, thinly sliced
- 1 medium sweet red pepper, thinly sliced
- 1/2 cup mayonnaise, divided
- 3/4 pound thinly sliced deli roast beef
- 1/4 cup Italian salad dressing
- 5 sandwich rolls, split
- · 3/4 cup shredded part-skim mozzarella cheese

DIRECTIONS

- In a large skillet, sauté the onion and peppers in 2 tablespoons of mayonnaise until crisptender. Remove vegetables and keep warm.
- In the same skillet, add the roast beef, Italian dressing and remaining mayonnaise. Cook and stir for 4-5 minutes or until heated through. Place beef and vegetables on rolls; sprinkle with mozzarella cheese. Yield: 5 servings.

Caramel Brownies Recipe

Caramel Brownies Recipe photo by Taste of Home Caramel Brownies Recipe Prep: 20 min. Bake: 35 min. + cooling Yield: 24 Servings 20 35 55

Ingredients

•2 cups sugar

•3/4 cup baking cocoa

- •1 cup canola oil
- •4 eggs
- •1/4 cup 2% milk
- •1-1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- •1 teaspoon salt

- •1 teaspoon baking powder
- •1 cup (6 ounces) semisweet chocolate chips
- •1 cup chopped walnuts, divided
- •14 ounces caramels
- •1 can (14 ounces) sweetened condensed milk

DIRECTIONS

- In a large bowl, beat the sugar, cocoa, oil, eggs and milk. Combine the flour, salt and baking powder; gradually add to egg mixture
 - until well blended. Fold in chocolate chips and 1/2 cup walnuts.
- Spoon two-thirds of the batter into a greased 13-in. x 9-in. baking pan. Bake at 350° for 12 minutes.
- Meanwhile, in a large saucepan, heat the caramels and condensed milk over low heat until caramels are melted. Pour over baked brownie layer. Sprinkle with remaining walnuts.
- Drop remaining batter by teaspoonfuls over caramel layer; carefully swirl brownie batter with a knife.
- Bake 35-40 minutes longer or until a tooth pick inserted near the center comes out with moist crumbs (do not overbake). Cool on a wire rack. Yield: 2 dozen.

BERLIN NOTES

In 1792 the District [of Berlin] built four (4) new schoolhouses. They were modeled after the typical old red schoolhouse of New England (dimensions 18 x 22 feet) at a total cost of about \$850. About 1875 the increase in the number of scholars in the center district justified a demand for additional school accommodations, so that "Barnes Hall" of the Town Hall was utilized as a schoolroom where more advanced pupils from all of the districts were instructed. This was known as the Berlin High School, which continued to function until 1879. From Frederick Krackhardts History of the Town of Berlin
