BERLIN SENIOR CITIZENS IN REVIEW

Unfortunately, Thursday, March 7th, the day of our Berlin Senior Citizens' monthly meeting...it SNOWED! We had to cancel our Life Care of Acton special health program and free of cost meal. Thanks to Jackie Wasmer, Director, who has succeeded Ben Moore, Life Care of Acton will re-schedule the meeting and the meal in the fall. Details will be forthcoming.

Dora Cummings, president of the month, conducted the meeting. The speaking program was represented in two parts:

The Berlin Fire Department was well represented at the April 4, 2013 monthly meeting by George Pendergast and Don Richer. Both firefighters addressed the need for the future acquisition of an Aerial Ladder Truck. George stated that since November 2012, the town of Berlin does not have a quint aerial ladder truck because the body & aerial of their truck was 31 years old along with the cab/engine chassis being 17 years old and cannot be retrofitted up to code. The need of an aerial ladder truck is imperative for the Berlin Fire Department in order to conduct rescue of victims and/or trapped firefighters; for fire operations, access to roofs and ventilation of buildings of heat, smoke and toxic gases. Currently, the Town must rely on mutual aid from other towns if and when available! Don Richer discussed details of the Fire Department's research for acquiring a new aerial ladder truck. George explained the cost and funding factors without the possibility of raising local taxes. Everyone was given a three page fact sheet. To obtain a fact sheet or for further information contact the Berlin Fire Department @ 978-838-2444. Mass. Public Health Nurse. Tamara Bedard of the Nashoba Associated Board of Health provided an informative discussion about diseases most commonly

spread by insects such as **Ticks and** Mosquitoes. She spoke of Prevention including types of clothing to wear, sprays to use (DET), and what to do when a tick is found on your skin. She discussed various diseases such as Lyme disease, Babesiosis, Anaplasmosis, Tularemia and Rocky Mountain spotted fever as a result of being infected by a bug or an insect. Hours from dusk to dawn are when mosquitoes bite. Nurse Tamara provided a 10 page Fact Sheet of information and gave everyone a "Tick Remover" kit along with her instructions of How-To-Grasp-&-Pull-the-Tick-Out.

Rhubarb Strawberry Granita

Ingredients

•3 cups water

•1 cup plus 2 tablespoons sugar

•1 cup diced fresh or frozen rhubarb, thawed

•1/2 cup halved fresh strawberries

2 tablespoons orange liqueur or orange juice

Directions

- Bring to a boil. Cook and stir until sugar is dissolved. Strain; discard
- · Pulp and seeds.
- Transfer syrup to an 8-in. square dish. Stir in orange liqueur; cool
- To room temperature. Freeze for 1 hour; stir with a fork. Freeze 2-3
- Hours longer or until completely frozen, stirring every 30 minutes.
- Stir granita with a fork just before serving;

JUNE RECIPE 2013

Creamy Asparagus Chowder Recipe Prep: 10 min. Cook: 30 min.

Yield: 10 Servings

Ingredients

- •2 medium onions, chopped
- •2 cups chopped celery
- •1/4 cup butter
- •1 garlic clove, minced
- •1/2 cup all-purpose flour
- •1 large potato, peeled and cut into 1/2-inch cubes.
- •4 cups milk
- •4 cups chicken broth
- •1/2 teaspoon dried thyme
- •1/2 teaspoon dried marjoram
- 4 cups chopped fresh asparagus, cooked and drained
- ·Salt and pepper to taste
- Sliced almonds
- Shredded cheddar cheese
- Chopped fresh tomato

Directions. In a Dutch oven, saute onions and celery in butter until tender. Add garlic; cook 1 minute longer. Stir in flour. Add the potato, milk, broth and herbs; cook over low heat, stirring occasionally until the potato is tender and soup is thickened, about 20-30 minutes.

VINTAGE POSTCARDS

As a collector of vintage postcards, mainly of the towns of Athol, MA and Orange, MA, I recently received a postcard dated posted 1906, of A Glimpse of Miller's River and State Road, West of Orange, MA. The postcard was addressed to a family living in Cottage City, Mass. This town was unfamiliar to me, so I did a little digging, which reveled that "The Town of Oak Bluffs is a

resort town on the northeast shore of the island of Martha's Vineyard, Massachusetts. Originally incorporated in 1880 as Cottage City, in 1907 the town's name was changed because of the growth in the year round population and the changing face of the resort required an acknowledgement the town was not just "Cottage City" any more."

The postcard was purchased on Ebay, and was mailed to me from out of state. It's amazing to find vintage postcards on EBay of the two towns, Athol and Orange. The postcard was mailed from the Orange Post Office, Aug. 27, 1906 to "Cottage City, Mass, when I purchased it on EBay, and it was mailed from out-of-state to me. "What goes around, comes around."
