The Calling All Seniors Project

By the time you read this, thirty-one volunteer callers will have concluded their work in reaching out to all Berlin residents over 60 concerning their health and other needs during the Covid 19 pandemic that has created such turmoil in our lives. The callers included many from the boards of the Berlin Council on Aging and the Berlin Senior Citizens Association, as well as several public-spirited members of the Berlin community at large.

Not everyone for whom we had accurate phone numbers was reached, and a number did not return messages left on answering machines, probably due to people's reluctance to respond to unknown numbers that they suspect may involve scam calls. While that was disappointing, the contacts that were made were warmly received and often resulted in great conversations with Berlin seniors who, in some cases, were previously unknown to the callers. Some of those called, and particularly those who are relatively new to town, learned of opportunities to engage with others in activities and programs offered by the Council on Aging (van transportation, Meals on Wheels, yoga, Tai Chi, tax work-off opportunities, etc.), the Food Pantry, Many Hands Thrift Shoppe, Nineteen Carter (Tea Time, Soup at Noon, Community Coffee, travelogues, movies, forums, classes, etc.), and the Berlin Public Library (musical programs, improv and informational programs in conjunction with Nineteen Carter and the 1870 Town Hall).

Our callers also alerted seniors to the availability of washable cloth face masks made by a number of industrious Berlin residents, including Cheryl LaRobadiere, Beezy Bentzen, Trudy Tervo and Sondra Pendergast and her daughter. In all, 80 or more (the number was still climbing as of this writing) were delivered by volunteers like Peggy Sardell and Ron Plutnicki.

Information about our postponed annual town meeting and voting dates was also relayed at the request of Town Clerk Eloise Salls.

At a time when most are heeding the call of health professionals to shelter in place and avoid close contact, it was heartening to realize that our community, while apart, is still very much together in spirit and in a willingness to help our neighbors and new-found friends. If there's a silver lining to the dark cloud hovering over us just now, it's in discovering that there are so many great and inspiring people all around us in Berlin and that we can share the sunshine with them when the clouds part, and share good conversations with them by phone and text and Zoom while we're hunkered down.

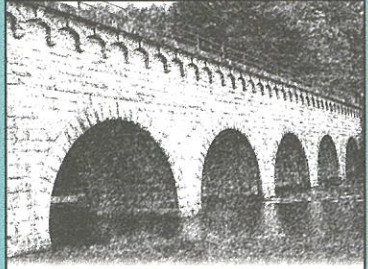

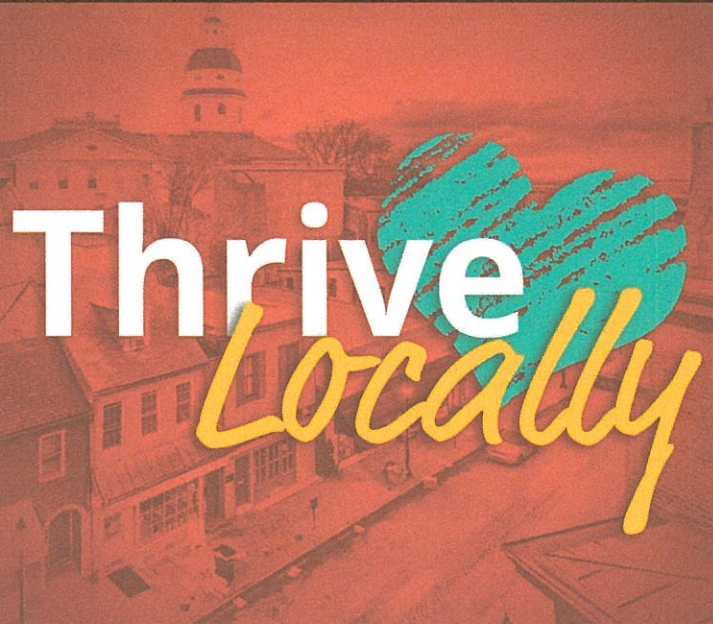

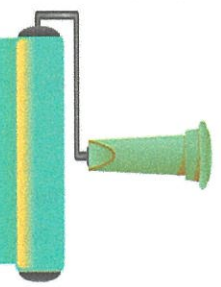

HOUSE NUMBERS

From the viewpoint of a driver trying to deliver cloth facemasks to Berlin seniors, MANY Berlin homeowners appear shy to clearly number their houses. It's a frustration for deliverers of masks and packages, but a serious safety issue for residents who hope emergency vehicles can find their homes in case of a fire or health emergency. But don't take our word for it. Take a drive around Berlin's streets yourself and see how many house numbers are readily seen at or from the roadside, compared with how many cannot. Include your own in your search. Berlin actually has an ordinance REQUIRING the installation of house or business numbers that are clearly visible from the road in front of them.

If you need help finding or installing 5 inch high numbers, of a color that contrasts with their backgrounds, let us know. Efforts are afoot to help residents achieve this critical safety goal. The Council on Aging phone number is: (978) 838-2750

Notes: The warrant for the 2020 Annual Town Meeting has closed (Feb. 18, 2020). Annual Town Meeting was originally scheduled for May 4, 2020. Annual Town Election was originally scheduled for May 11, 2020.

- World Health Organization's naming COVID-19 as a pandemic (Mar. 11, 2020);

- 5) **Berlin Food Pantry** — If financial hardship keeps you from buying adequate amounts of food, call Berlin Food Pantry's Fran Gill at **(978) 838-2508**.
- 6) For inclusion in the **Meals On Wheels** program, which delivers packaged meals twice weekly to residents who need help with preparing regular meals, **call the Council on Aging at (978) 838-2750**.
- 7) We are not sure how this Corona virus pandemic will ultimately play out, but we ARE sure that we, at the Berlin Council on Aging, will be here for you during and long after the immediate crisis. Don't hesitate to call us for any of the needs mentioned above, or simply if you are stressed and lonely and want to engage in friendly, reassuring conversation. We'll get through this together. REGISTRY OF MOTOR VEHICLES

Further Extensions Implemented for Expiring Licenses, Permits, Motor Vehicle Inspection Stickers, and Passenger Plate Registrations

While 60-day extensions had already been implemented for most credentials, passenger plate registrations, and inspection stickers expired or expiring in March and April, this new action will apply the same 60-day extension to those expiring in May. Additionally, credentials expiring in March 2020 that previously were extended by 60 days will have an additional 60-day extension applied.

Notice To Berlin Taxpayers

Extended due dates for Real Estate, Personal Property and Excise Taxes

Due to financial impacts on taxpayers as a result of COVID-19 declared health emergency, Governor Baker signed legislation allowing local municipalities to extend due dates for tax payments. The Town of Berlin, by unanimous vote of its Board of Selectmen on Tuesday, April 21, adopted certain sections of this legislation to extend due dates for real estate and personal property tax payments, and excise tax payments, specifically as follows.

1. Real Estate and Personal Property Taxes — The due date of your real and personal property tax bill has been extended to Monday, June 1, 2020. June 1, 2020 is the new due date even though the due date for payment on your previously mailed tax bill shows May 1, 2020.

Late payments received after office hours close at 4:30 p.m. on Monday, June 1, 2020 will not be honored and will be subject to retro interest and a \$15.00 demand fee. Physical payments must be in the Treasurer/Collector's office by 4:30 p.m. on Monday, June 1, 2020 if made by mail or dropped off in the secured drop-off box in the Town Offices lobby. We will not accept the post marked date if payments are not received by 4:30 p.m. on June 1, 2020. Online payments can also be made online at the Town's website www.townofberlin.com and must be made by 4:30 p.m. on Monday, June 1, 2020.

2. Automobile Excise Tax — Interest and other penalties have been waived for late payment of any excise with a due date on or after March 10, 2020 where payment is made late but no later than the close of office hours at 4:30 a.m. on Monday, June 29, 2020.

Late payments received after office hours close at 4:30 p.m. on Monday, June 29, 2020 will not be honored and will be subject to retro interest and a \$15.00 demand fee. Physical payments

must be in the Treasurer/Collector's office by 4:30 p.m. on Monday, June 29, 2020 if made by mail or dropped off in the secured drop-off box in the Town Offices lobby. We will not accept the post marked date if payments are not received by 4:30 p.m. June 29, 2020. Online payments can also be made online at the Town's website www.townofberlin.com and must be made by 4:30 p.m. on Monday, June 29, 2020.

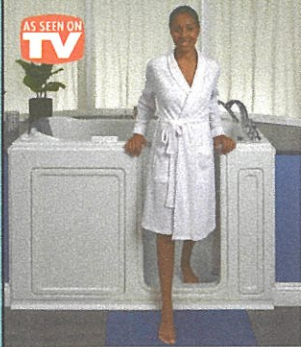

Medicare and the Coronavirus

Medicare Part B (Medical Insurance) covers medically necessary clinical diagnostic laboratory tests, when your doctor or practitioner orders them. This includes a test to see if you have coronavirus (officially called 2019-novel coronavirus or COVID-19).

Original Medicare: You usually pay nothing for Medicare-covered clinical diagnostic laboratory tests.

Medicare Advantage Plans: Check with your plan's Explanation of Benefits or call them to see if there is a co-pay.

MassHealth Eligibility Guidelines Have Increased

Income and asset guidelines change every year. MassHealth has increased the income limits for several programs you may be eligible for. The monthly gross monthly income to be eligible for MassHealth Standard has increased from \$1,041 for a single person to \$1,064, with assets no more than \$2,000, for a married couple it has gone up to from \$1,410 to \$1,437, with assets no more than \$3,000.

The MassHealth Buy-in Programs, also called Medicare Savings Program, pay for the Part B monthly premium, \$144.60 in 2020. The gross monthly income eligibility for a single person is now \$1,755, with assets no higher than \$15,720; and for a couple \$2,371, with assets no higher than \$23,600. These increases also apply to Full Extra Help for Massachusetts residents. This program from Social Security helps to pay for your medications.
